Lawrence Intersection Repair, 2015

The first time I rode my bike over an Intersection Repair in Portland, I stopped, got off my bike and was amazed by the vibrant swatches of color arranged on the asphalt in the middle of an intersection. The surrounding neighborhood was so alive with activity and sounds- it reminded me of my home in East Lawrence. That experience inspired me to bring this project to Kansas, to make an impact in the arts, in the community, strengthening our roots one intersection at a time.

Intersection Repair is the community driven transformation of a street intersection into a safer, more beautiful public space. In 1996, Portland, Oregon organization City Repair started painting murals directly onto residential intersections within a neighborhood. These engaging collaborative artworks are intended to create a sense of identity among neighbors while helping to calm traffic, promote local culture, and serve as a central gathering space for a community.

It takes a whole village to create usable, inclusive public spaces- and that's exactly who we hope will be participating in this project. The design of the mural will be driven by the community's vision- anyone that has an interest can participate in the design process, and all ideas will be considered. The actual painting of the intersection will also be accomplished entirely by community effort. This project will reach a large audience not only during the design process, but also after its been completed. Over the years we hope thousands of people will pass over the intersection and be inspired by its art and beauty.

This Intersection Repair will be the first of its kind in the state of Kansas, and as a public art project, it has the potential to reach all kinds of different audiences in a unique way. Intersection Repair also deepens community participation in the arts in that it provides a central gathering space for communication, ideas and art to flourish. An Intersection Repair serves as a constant source of inspiration for those that are near it.

In order to engage as large of an audience as possible in the design process, we have been persistent in our flyering efforts. In addition, we have visited the houses surrounding the intersection to discuss ideas / concerns with the residents. We are also active on our Lawrence Intersection Repair Facebook page and regularly have updates in the ELNA newsletter.

Lawrence Intersection Repair's core team consists of artist Alicia Kelly who is acting as director, and Katy Clagett who is assisting Alicia in her efforts. We have had great success engaging community partners in this project as well. The East Lawrence Neighborhood Association and Nancy DeGarmo, principal of New York Elementary School are both key contributors and supporters. The Percolator, who is serving as our fiscal agent, stands by our side as well and is the site of the design meetings. This strong group of engaged community

partners will increase the level of diversity of participants. Indeed, participants will range from elementary school students to longstanding residents of the neighborhood.

While we won't be painting the proposed intersection of 10th and New Jersey (chosen for its proximity to New York Elementary and also for its role as a central node in the neighborhood) until this fall when construction on New York Elementary school concludes, we are currently busy at work preparing. We have met with Assistant City Manager Diane Stoddard and Assistant Director of Public Works Mark Thiel, who have helped guide our efforts in going through the proper city approval channels. We will be going before the Traffic Saftey Commission and the Historic Resources Commission in the upcoming weeks as well. We've successfully hosted one design meeting, with a second to follow this week. We will have a booth at the ELNA Yart Sale to discuss our efforts with the community at large, and we will also be hosting a Fundraiser for the project this Spring at the 8th Street Taproom.

For the actual painting of the intersection, we will gather as many community members as we can for a Painting Party. The Painting Party will be a one-day event, in which we, in collaboration with the Public Works Department, shut down the streets and set to work putting the community's vision onto the asphalt. The Painting Party will be an all ages, inclusive affair that will culminate with a block party celebrating the new addition to the neighborhood and the many new connections made. We also intend to have an annual Painting Party that will serve to both maintain the intersection and continue strengthening community bonds.

This process of community building doesn't culminate with the painting of this intersection mural, instead, we see it just the beginning, a jumping off point of sorts. It is the hope of Lawrence Intersection Repair that 10th and New Jersey will be the first of many more intersection repairs in Lawrence.

BUDGET JUSTIFICATION

1. Personnel

Director and assistant will be paid \$1000 between then. The Design Team's in-kind donation is approximated at \$650 (4 meetings, 1.5 hours per meeting, \$11/hour, 10 members). Funding for personnel is to come from LCAC Grant, Private Donation from Richard Krank and in-kind donation.

2. Fees and Services

Fiscal Agent will earn a 7% fee, equaling \$240. Permits will cost \$10. The Taproom is donating their venue for a Lawrence Intersection Repair fundraiser this Spring and bands will donate their time to play said fundraiser. The combined value of these inkind donations is estimated at \$300. Funding for fees and services to come from Private Donation from Richard Krank and in-kind Bantal Faes

3. Rental Fees

A power washer and tables will be rented for the Painting Day Party at a cost of \$120. Funding for rental fees will come from Spring Fundraiser at the Taproom.

4. Travel

5. Marketing Expenses

Flyers advertising the design meetings and Painting Day Party and t-shirts for participants (\$200) will be locally sourced, and will encourgage additional community participation and engagement. Funding for marketing expenses will come from Spring Fundraiser at the Taproom.

6. Materials Expenses

Latex zoning paint will cost \$550, paint additive will cost \$20, and painting supplies (brushes, tarps, buckets) will cost \$200. Its important to purchase painting supplies new so they can be readily available for future maintenance and for future Intersection Repair projects. Additional paint will be purchased for future maintenance use. Funding for materials to come from LCAC Grant.

7. Operating Expenses

8. Other Expenses

Other expenses include all costs associated with the Painting Day Party this Fall. Funding for other expenses to come from Spring Fundraiser at the Taproom.

NOTE: We have recieved a commitment for a \$500 private donation from Richard Krank. In addition, we anticipate raising \$500 from a Spring Fundraiser at the Taproom (see attached letter of commitment).

The Taproom is excited about the upcoming Lawrence Intersection Repair project at 10th and New Jersey and is committed to allowing Lawrence Intersection Repair to use the Taproom on a mutually acceptable date for a fundraiser this Spring/ Summer.

The Taproom will donate the space and the staff for the event and all proceeds from cover the day of will be remitted to Lawrence Intersection Repair's Fiscal Agent, the Percolator. The Taproom will also work with whichever bands Lawrence Intersection Repair selects to play to ensure a high quality of sound.

The Taproom values this donation at about two hundred dollars.

Alicia Kelly was born among the wildflowers and red dirt of Northeastern Oklahoma. After graduating from The University of Kansas in 2010 with a Fine Arts Degree in Printmaking, she ventured to the coasts to expand her studio practice. In 2007, she moved back to Lawrence and has been active in the community arts since, displaying and curating works.

Her love of paper developed alongside her love of South American textiles, which lead her to a meditative act of paper cutting. Her most recent works have 'grown' out of the ordinary frame and usually encapsulate whole rooms. Her past installations emphasize the idea of public space and how others interact with public art. During these installations, a vital part of the work itself is the interaction and organization of community members to participate in the creation. This has lead her to identify and deepen connections to the Lawrence community and to move towards more public placemaking-type works.


