Hello Phil.

Hopefully I can clear up any confusion.

Please see the map attached in regards to specific street closure request. We discussed at the Elna meeting and took the recommendation of making 9th St one-way from the alley between Penn & New Jersey west to New Jersey. Originally we had proposed closing that portion of 9th from the alley to New Jersey. The gate on the alley, north side of 9th, will be staffed and allow for exit or entrance from those residents that need access to their alley parking. Does this correlate with your understanding from that meeting?

Traffic Notification::

We discussed, and the public works has agreed, to make use of their Electronic Traffic signs at the corners of 11th & Delaware, 10th & Delaware and a No Outlet or Dead End sign at the corner of 10th and Pennsylvania so traffic does not come

down that street looking for an outlet. I would yield to Mark Thiel/Public works on proper communication on those electronic signs in regards to specific recommendations for traffic to use.

Hi Mark. Is there a traffic plan for the proposed Food Truck Fest?

I see this in their request for City Services:

Fire Medical services

None. Traffic plan will be provided with Right of Way permit.

Since this is the first time these streets are being closed, and there is a significant amount of traffic that uses the route from 11th street to Delaware to westbound 6th street and to northbound over the river, what will that traffic plan look like? I would suggest it should get some extra scrutiny for the city. It is not a routine closure.

Hello Bobbie,

Would you place this in the commission packets.

Please make the developer pay for the 30 foot easement belonging to the city. The 123 building ,on 8th street ,wanted 6 parking spaces ,in the city lot ,to build an addition onto the building. The city commission at that time valued the parking spaces at \$40,000 per space. It would be a mistake to give up 6 downtown spaces for free,or for \$70,000 for 6 parking spaces that exist in the space now being considered to be vacated.

On another issue. The food truck festival. Why is the city providing free services to the Cider galley? I'm confused as to the 5 parking lots on Delaware that are being offered for parking. Two of these lots already provide parking for the Poehler building, and 9 del lofts. How many spaces in the other 3 lots are available? I don't think there is enough parking provided for this event. Closing East 9th at Pennsylvania and Delaware will move traffic into the neighborhood. Move the event out to the Sport Palace.
