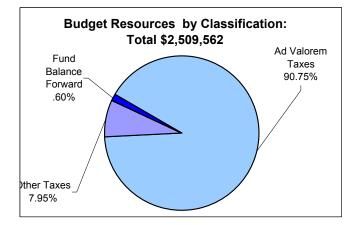

Revenue Sources - Description and Trends

<u>Revenue Sources</u>- Property taxes are the major source of revenue for the Library Fund, followed by motor vehicle tax. The Lawrence Public Library anticipates receiving almost 91% of their 2005 funding from the City of Lawrence Library Fund. The remaining sources of revenue for the Library operations include State aid, grants, and income from overdue fines and misc. library services.

<u>Trends</u>- Non-tax fund revenues are anticipated to be relatively flat for the Library, including interest income, State aid, and ongoing grant commitments. The anticipated 6% increase in assessed property valuations will provide some additional revenue however, the Clty Commission has indicated that adequately funding the Library is a top priority for 2005. Therefore, an increase of .445 mills has been included for this fund for 2005.
