Dear Debbie:

On behalf of the Lawrence Chamber of Commerce and the KU Small Business Development Center, we respectfully submit the enclosed 2007 partnership budget proposal.

As you will see in the attached budget, the Economic Development Program is jointly funded by the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, and the Lawrence Chamber of Commerce and is administered by the Lawrence Chamber of Commerce. The 2007 budget request is for \$195,000 with \$20,000 for SBDC and the balance for the Economic Development program.

Description/Justification/New Programs:

The City of Lawrence has contributed to the Douglas County Economic Development program for over a decade as part of a partnership that exists with Douglas County and the Chamber of Commerce. Douglas County Economic Development provides full service economic development programs for Douglas County. The importance of the program is easily defined by numbers; in 2005 the program created 422 new jobs for citizens of Douglas County and over \$16,778,500 new investment for our tax base.

In 2007, we will continue our proactive economic development programs and enhance our current initiatives. Face-to-face communication is still the #1 way to get someone's attention and gain trust. This is a very important factor in economic development. Meeting with national site location consultants, real estate brokers, company executives, and others is integral in the process of attracting and retaining current businesses. Knowing the importance of communication, the Economic Development Department is researching conferences that provide the best networking opportunities, developing tours and events to bring consultants to Lawrence, and scheduling visits to the Corporate Headquarters of local companies. Communication is key to our efforts to pursue a corporate environment that will import new investment, create opportunities for current and future growth, decrease the drive-away factor, and increase the tax base, all the while maintaining the quality of life that we enjoy.

Additional funding is greatly needed for the economic development department to perform at a higher level. The environment for business development and attraction is becoming increasingly more competitive and Lawrence needs to step-up our efforts to stay in the game. Funding is needed to increase our marketing and advertising efforts as well as increase our efforts related to business attraction. Advertising opportunities in magazines such as Forbes and Fortune are available through our partners at Kansas Department of Commerce and Kansas City Area Development Council, but the cost of one ad is the cost of the entire current economic development marketing budget and therefore not plausible. The additional funds requested will allow us to market in these nation-wide publications as well as show our partners and others that we are ready for increased visibility.

Attracting companies that increase our local tax base as well as bring higher paying jobs, is important to Lawrence and Douglas County and a main focus of the economic development department. However, the game of attracting companies is changing. Incentives have always been important but the importance is increasing. In

order for Lawrence to remain competitive we need to have funds available to assist companies with infrastructure, utility, building, and equipment needs. This will also provide the ability to retain professional industry assistance to assist in our attraction activities. Additional funding will allow this opportunity to work towards attracting the companies and corporate headquarters that can make a large impact on the economy of the city and county.

Outside Funding/Total Budget/Revenue-Related Issues

As you are aware, Douglas County Economic Development receives funding from Douglas County, the Lawrence Chamber of Commerce, Douglas County Development, Inc. and the City of Lawrence. Additionally, the program receives funds from 125 private sector businesses as a result of the Excellence by Design fundraising campaign. Fundraising has already begun on the FOCUS[ED campaign which begins the 4th Quarter of the current budget year.

The partnership funding (City, County and Chamber) is essential to continuation of the successful program. Because of the increased costs associated with operating economic development programs and initiatives in an extremely competitive environment, public and private sector funds are necessary. We are only able to maximize private sector investments on the basis of a strong partnership with the public sector.

Employee Salary Increases

The attached budget includes 3% employee salary increases or cost of living increases for the economic development staff including three full-time positions and a partial salary of the front desk position.

Horizon 2020 Initiatives

The Horizon 2020 Economic Development Initiatives provides for continued City and County funding for the KU Small Business Development Center. This year, SBDC is requesting a total of \$20,000 from the City, which is the same amount as last year.

In addition to the funds from the city and county, the KU Small Business Development Center also receives grant funding from the Small Business Administration (federal SBA), the Kansas Department of Commerce (KDOC) and the University of Kansas (KU). The local dollars (city, county and university) are used in matching grant calculation that brings both state and federal dollars into the local economy.

Thank you for your continued support the Economic Development program of the Lawrence Chamber of Commerce. We look forward to continuing our successful partnership.
