There is a need to open more doors of opportunities and to maintain the goal of freedom for people of every nationality.

We should not repeat history and the problem of discrimination. The city has a need to help stop discrimination and to continue to lead in freedom and equal opportunity. Healthy communities work together to help individuals, families, businesses and organizations to overcome discrimination barriers and to embrace freedom.
