Jayhawk Watershed Project

This transformative, multi-year project will bring new stormwater infrastructure, reduce flooding, and protect neighborhoods and businesses from future storms.

We're also updating 9th St., installing wider bike lanes while maintaining parking spaces, adding a new crosswalk beacon, and updating the sidewalks to meet ADA accessibility standards.

The first phase of work will require crews to close Tennessee St. between 6th St. and 9th St.

Detours will be clearly marked to maintain access for residents and businesses.

Maple Lane Reconstruction

Maple Lane will be rebuilt from the ground up, with improved drainage and durable pavement.

We're also improving the storm sewer, sanitary sewer, and the watermain along Maple Lane and 19th St. We're also adding new bus stops on 19th St.

UPCOMING PEDESTRIAN & MULTIMODAL PROJECTS

Our pedestrian, sidewalk, and multimodal projects are key to making Lawrence accessible, safe, and enjoyable for everyone-whether you're walking to school, biking to work, or simply enjoying our vibrant community.

City Sidewalk Projects

Tennessee St. Sidewalk Replacement

On Tennessee, we're replacing the sidewalks and ramps to be ADA accessible at various spots between 9th St. and 14th St. Construction will begin in Late Spring 2025.

6th St. Shared-Use Path

We're building a new shared-use path on the north side of 6th St. from Lawrence Ave. to Kasold Dr., creating a safer route for pedestrians and cyclists. The north lane on 6th St. will be closed during construction. Construction will begin in Summer 2025.

Ousdahl Sidewalk Project

We're filling in sidewalk gaps along Ousdahl Rd. between 26th and 19th St., making it easier and safer for pedestrians to travel through the area. Plus, a new crosswalk at W 22nd St. Construction will begin in March 2025.

Connecticut St. ADA Project - 9th St. to 12th St.

We're reconstructing sidewalks and adding new ADAcompliant curb ramps on Connecticut Street between 9th and 12th Streets, improving accessibility and pedestrian safety in the area. Construction is scheduled to start in Fall 2025.

E. 12th St. - New Hampshire St. to Oregon St.

We're reconstructing sidewalks along 12th St. from New Hampshire St. to Oregon St. to improve accessibility and safety. These upgrades will replace aging brick and concrete sidewalks in poor condition. Construction will begin in Late 2025.

19th St. & Tennessee St. **Signal Replacement**

We're fully replacing the traffic signal at 19th & Tennessee, along with a new, ADA-compliant street crossings. This work will be completed in Summer 2025 to minimize the impact on nearby schools.

Iowa St. - 23rd to Irving Hill Road

Our lowa St. project will bring major upgrades to one of Lawrence's busiest corridors, including improved pavement, upgraded stormwater systems, a shared-use path, and enhanced safety features for all travelers.

Bob Billings - Kasold to Monterey Way

The Bob Billings Parkway reconstruction project will enhance connectivity with a full roadway rebuild, a new shared-use path, and sidewalk improvements. The project also includes replacing the storm sewer system and water main.
